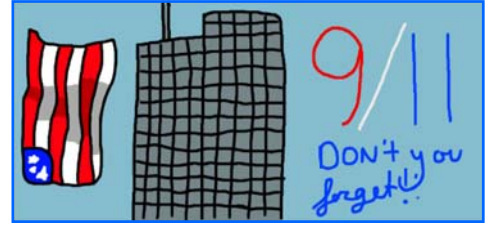

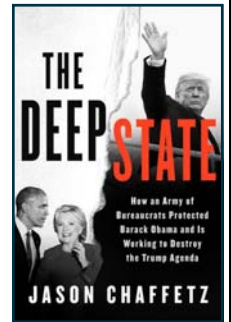

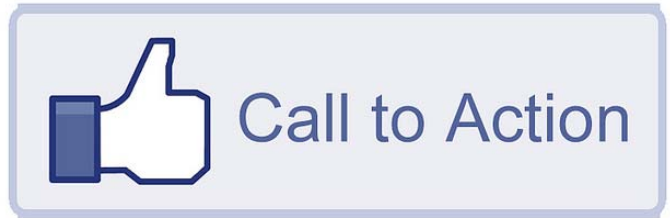


About Our Speaker Robin Itzler

Today, another big promise kept

Announced this morning, President Donald J. Trump is delivering on his promise to renegotiate the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) so all American workers can benefit. The deal will also include the strongest, fully enforceable labor standards of any trade agreement.

“Many people thought that this was something that just couldn't happen because of all of the different factions, all of the different sides, and the complexity,” President Trump said this morning. “And we made it much simpler, much better. Much better for both countries.”

Sex Ed and the California Teachers Union

Did you know that fewer than 5% who run for office in California hold Judeo-Christian beliefs? These 5 counties comprise 319 square miles.

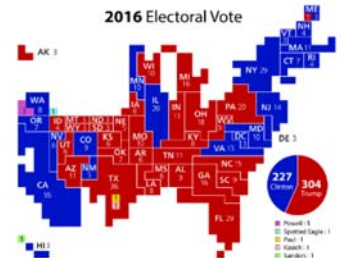
The United States is comprised of 3,797,000 square miles.

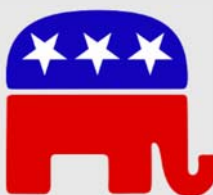
